MOTION TO DELAY DISTRIBUTION OF A PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

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To the Honorable Elena Kagan, as Circuit Justice for the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit:

Pursuant to this Court's March 19, 2020 Order, Petitioner Robert Ybarra, Jr., respectfully requests this Court delay distribution of his petition for writ of certiorari in *Ybarra v. Gittere*, No. 19-8239, until the June 10, 2020 distribution date due to difficulties related to COVID-19.

- Robert Ybarra, Jr., filed a petition for writ of certiorari on March 31,
 2020, raising a constitutional question about applying *Hurst v. Florida*, 136 S. Ct.
 616 (2016) to Nevada's capital sentencing scheme.
- Respondent William Gittere filed his brief in opposition on May 11,
 2020.

- 3. Based on the filing date of this brief in opposition, without an extension of time, Mr. Ybarra would need to file his reply brief by May 26, 2020. *See* S. Ct. R. 15(5)–(6).¹
- 4. Mr. Ybarra respectfully requests that this Court delay distribution of his petition for writ of certiorari until the June 10, 2020 distribution deadline based upon difficulties resulting from the COVID-19 crisis. As the lead attorney and drafter of the Reply, the undersigned's efforts to draft the reply will be hampered by his involvement in COVID-19 related office projects. This work is in addition to the regular press of business. Additionally, the undersigned is working remotely from home, which brings daily challenges delaying progress.
- 5. This later distribution creates a sixteen-day extension of time on the reply brief.
- 6. This request comes well before the two days prior to the current distribution date, as specified in the March 19, 2020 order.

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¹ Because May 25, 2020 is a federal holiday, the two-week period contemplated under S. Ct. R. 15(5) would extend to May 26, 2020. *See* S. Ct. R. 30(1).

7. On May 11, 2020, I contacted counsel for Respondents, Chief Deputy
Attorney General, Heather Dr. Procter. She indicated no opposition to this request.
