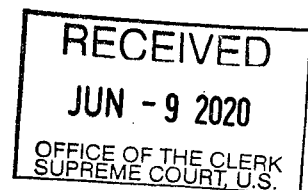

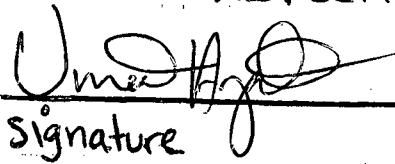
Petitioner, Pro se, Vincent A. Argentino, Respectfully requests in accordance with SUPREME COURT RULE. 21., THE HONORABLE Justice Gorsuch grant Petitioners motion to Exceed nine and half pages in his WRIT FOR CERTIORARI, for the following reasons:

1. Due to the tragic events of the Coronavirus, South Central Correctional Center (S.C.C.C.) where the inmate is incarcerated; is only allowing ten inmates in the law library at a time, per safety precautions.
2. This has caused the Petitioner to barely have time to find case law, relevant to his WRIT FOR CERTIORARI.
3. The Petitioner just started typing on or about three months ago, but in order to receive extra law time he needs an order from the Court showing a deadline. Being as the Petitioner types very

slow he would need extra law time being; as normally he only receives 12 hours a week. in order to have a typed petition and make his deadline of June 25, 2020. Being as if his Petition were typed instead of hand written it would be 40 pages per Rule 33.
