STATEMENT OF THE CASE

BOTH THE DISTRICT COURT FOR THE MIDDLE DISTRICT OF NORTH CAROLINA, AND THE COURT OF APPEALS FOR THE FOURTH CIRCUIT DISMISSED PETITIONER'S COMPLAINT.

THE MIDDLE DISTRICT OF NORTH CAROLINA DISMISSED PLAINTIFF'S ACTION PURSUANT TO 28 U.S.C. 1915 (E)(2)(B)(ii) AND THE COURT OF APPEALS DISMISSED PETITIONER'S APPEAL FOR LACK OF SUBJECT MATTER JURISDICTION.

IN ORDER TO SURVIVE A MOTION TO DISMISS, COMPLAINT MUST CONTAIN SUFFICIENT FACTUAL MATTER ACCEPTED AS TRUE TO STATE A CLAIM OF RELIEF THAT IS PLAUSIBLE ON ITS FACE; CLAIM HAS FACIAL PLAUSIBILITY WHEN PLAINTIFF PLEADS FACTUAL CONTENT THAT ALLOWS THE COURT TO DRAW AN REASONABLE INFERENCE THAT DEFENDANT IS LIABLE FOR MISCONDUCT.

PETITIONER HAS BOTH AN CONSTITUTIONAL AND STATUTORY RIGHT TO APPEAL THE FINAL JUDGMENT OF AN DISTRICT COURT PURSUANT ACCORDING TO 28 U.S.C. 2107; UNPUBLISHED OPINIONS ARE NOT BINDING PRECEDENT.
