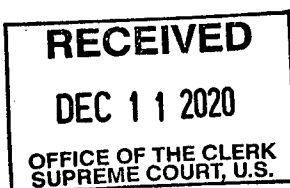
In Support of this petition/Motion the supporting Amended/ADD facts are as follows

supporting facts: *Brady v Maryland* 383, 836 Ct 1194 10 L.Ed 2d 215 (1963)

1 CLAIM suppression by the prosecution of evidence clearly favorable to AN Accused violates AMONG civil rights being the life and liberty AND sole property of the petitioner found in the MAGNA CARTA. IT WAS preserved in MANY of the early state constitutions in its various forms WAS embodied in the Federal Constitution by one of the early Amendments AS A limitation on Federal power, & finally in the fourteenth Amendment Due process of LAW

supporting facts: *Jackson v Virginia* 443 US 307 (1979), *Mestas v People* P3d 94 Colo (2019) + *McCoy v People* 2019 (044 (2019))

2 CLAIM substantially different evidence - previous interloctory is binding unless "only" one light in the evidence, conspiracy to manufacture false evidence, false testimony to receive A wrongful conviction; Does QUALIFY AS A CONSTITUTIONAL VIOLATION under Article III of the constitution substantially

claim-3 under Article III of the Constitution - The Bill of Rights For criminal defendants Fifth Amendment For infamous crimes prohibitions Against double jeopardy compulsory self incrimination of ~~life~~ and deprivation of life, liberty or property without due process of law
