Dear Mr. Harris:

I represent respondents Parke Bank, Vito Pantilione and Ralph Gallo in the above-referenced case. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, kindly accept this letter as respondents' motion to extend the time to file a brief in opposition to the petition for writ of certiorari. I am respectfully requesting an extension of 21 days, to and including Thursday, March 12, 2020, to file the brief. Absent an extension, the brief would be due on February 20, 2020. This is the first extension respondents have sought. Petitioners' counsel do not oppose the extension.

By way of explanation, in early February I suffered a full-thickness supraspinatus (rotator cuff) tear in my dominant-hand shoulder, necessitating a not insubstantial amount of interaction with the medical community to diagnose the injury and schedule surgery.
