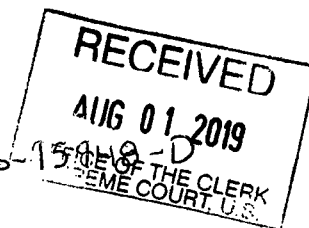

Appellant's Motion for 60-Days Extension of time to file a Writ of Certiorari

Pursuant to the UNITED STATES SUPREME COURT RULE 30 (2) an application to extend the time to file a petition for a writ of Certiorari or to file a jurisdictional statement must be filed at least 10 days before the Specified final filing date as Computed under these rules; if filed less than 10 days before the final filing date...
