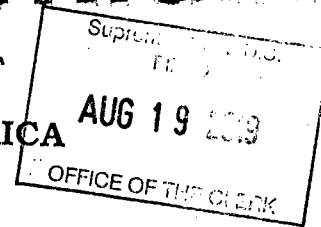

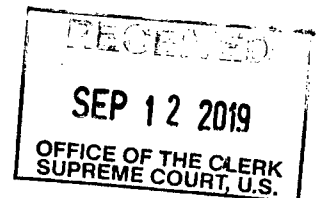
**APPICATION FOR EXETENSION OF FILING DEADLINE
FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI**

Comes Now Kenneth N McFall Pro-se and respectfully seeks an extension of time in which his Writ of Certiorari must be filed.

McFall asserts the following facts for the courts review in support of McFall's application for extension of deadline for the filing of Writ of Certiorari.

The Petitioner was charged with multiple felony counts relating to the possession of and the dealing of Methamphetamine in the Perry County Circuit Court in the State of Indiana. *Case # 62001-184-F3-DM-27107*

The Petitioner Proceeded to through the Court process into a Jury Trial on August 6th 2018 where the Petitioner was ultimately found guilty of The Charge on August 8th 2018 of dealing in Methamphetamine a Schedule 3 felony (class B).



The Petitioner appealed sentence and conviction to the Indiana Court of Appeals which resulted in a denial of the Petitioners Appeal *See Attached Exhibit A*

The Petitioner then sought transfer to The Indiana Supreme Court for final review by the Indiana Supreme Court.

Transfer of the Petitioners appeal to the Indiana Supreme Court was denied on June 18th 2019 petitioner now seeks Certiorari review and needs an extension of filing deadline to do so. *See Attached Exhibit B*

Petitioner Is Currently Incarcerated in the Indiana Department of Corrections at the Branchville Correctional Facility located 21390 Old State Road 37 Branchville Indiana.

Petitioner has limited knowledge of the law and limited access to the prisons Law Library. The Petitioner's conviction and denial of appeals he believes are contrary to established Federal Court precedents concerning violations of the fourth amendment's prohibition against unreasonable search and seizure where a search warrant has secured upon unreliable and perjured statements and violation of sixth amendment confrontation clause that creates a violation of constitutional rights that can only be answered by the United States Supreme Court.




