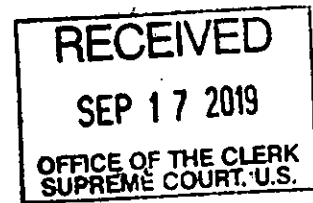

RE: Request to Extend Time to file Writ

Dear Mr. Harris,

I am requesting an extension of time to file for a writ of Certiorari. The reasons are as followed.

1. - In addition to filing my writ I also need to file an IN FORMA PAUPERIS request and as of yet I have not recieved a reply or the required paperwork to properly complete and supply proofs. I requested the information on 7/30/19 and will again enclose said request.
2. - I must also find a way to ensure the typing is correct due to there not being a setting on our typewriters to comply with the booklet size requirments.
3. - Access to the law library is limited and I usually get here about twice per week.
4. - I can only type at the law library since the tablet program has not started and I do not forsee them starting with in the next few weeks.

Additional Facts for consideration.

A. - On 3/22/19 the 4th dept. affirmed my conviction and I wrote to the NYS Court of appeals the highest court in New York State.

B. - On 5/13/19 Hon. Jenny Rivera of the NYS Court of appeals denied my enterance into the courts with out explanation.

C. - I wrote and requested recoderation and on 6/26/19 the same judge Hon. Rivera denied reconsideration again with out explnation.


This started my 90 days which will end 09/26/2019.

I am requesting this Extention in Advance and more than the required 10 days in hopes of an easier decision and with in the rules set forth and enacted 7/01/19.

AS per rule 30 and having served all parties involved I request respectfully you grant me an extension to file my WRIT OF CERTIORARI and IN FORMA PAUPERIS. Enclosed are proofs of dates and decesions by the Court of Appeals via Hon. Rivera as well as proof of service to the Erie County D.A.'s office (Rule 22).
