I represent Chesley Eugene Saunders in the above-entitled action. On July 8, 2019, the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit denied my client a Certificate of Appealability, effectively affirming a judgment of the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida. That judgment denied my client a writ of habeas corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2254.

The petition in this Court is due on or before October 7, 2019. I write to respectfully request an additional 30 days to file the petition for a writ of certiorari to November 8, 2019. I make this request because I have several other cases with pressing deadlines and because I need to confer with my client about a specific issue and he is presently incarcerated, making communication with him difficult.


