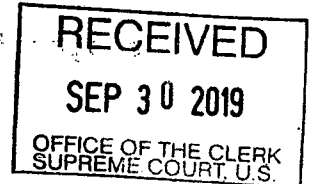

LETTER TO THE CLERK

Reason(s) For Requesting an Extension:

Dear Clerk,

I am seeking an extension of time in which to file a Writ of Certiorari due to several unforeseen occurrences which I had no control. Initially, where the 'Order' denying my Direct Appeal, was mailed out by the Court on July 09, 2019, I did not receive a copy of this document, until about August 16, almost a month later. In addition, I was subsequently transferred from F.C.I Tucson, and was in transit for 18 days before arriving here at F.C.I. Herlong, California. Shortly, after arriving here I was taken to the (SHU)/Hole/ Administrative Detention, for 14 days, for violating some innocuous, and petty rule. Nonetheless, in addition I am but a layman untrained and unskilled in the law. Thus, where I cannot afford to retain a lawyer, I am proceeding pro se.
