MOTION / REQUEST FOR GRANTING PRO SE TO EXCEED PAGE
COUNT OF 40 DUE TO EXTRAORDINARY CIRCUMSTANCES.

To the Honorable Justice Sonia Sotomayor,

I am a pro se; my case is William Yeager v. NPR, which concerns the media and press (National Public Radio) regarding defamation, libel (publication) and slander (All Things Considered - radio air-waves.) I have an 8th grade education, my wife is helping me. Our lives were completely destroyed by NPR, it has been a tremendous burden for 2 years now. I was robbed of my reputation and dignity, 19 million people were told I was a fraud, it reached all the way to my little hometown population 875 in Kansas.

I attempted suicide, and because of this I am on anti-depressants and PTSD medications (I had never taken anything more than an aspirin in my life).

My wife and I are artists, activists and humanitarians. I pray and plead the Good Lord will give you the understanding, wisdom, grace and mercy to please accept this Motion.

(1) I fully understand this motion and request should be saved for only those who really need them, the Courts are busy, there are serious matters, I have the utmost respect for what you do for this Great Nation we live in.

I have exceeded the 'page count' because my writ contains many questions, many concern Constitutional matters, and an "act of Congress."

In short it addresses, involuntarily limited-purpose public figure, actual malice, matter of public concern (Chief Justice John G. Roberts disjunctive tests (Phelps v.)), viewpoint discrimination, the fact that National Public Radio is funded by the public and the government, and whether the government is a joint participant invoking the 14th amendment, prior restraint and censorship by NPR, an Act of Congress violation (FCC) removal of the fairness doctrine, equal time, personal attack rule,

when the Supreme Court ruled the Fairness doctrine was Constitutional in Red Lion; it is an extremely complex case, and I believe the Court will need all my citations and facts to understand my questions, more so because I am not a lawyer.

My wife and I care about humanity, we care about consciousness, justice, goodness and truth. We were preparing our benefit concerts when this devastation happened, the concerts were going to raise money to provide wheelchairs to land-mine victims in 3rd world countries; over 100 million people still don't own a wheelchair.

The media can be cynical, crude, cruel and unprofessional, they can spread false information, report fear based news, create click-bait stories and destroy people's reputations, because the present laws protect them too much.

My wife and I are not fighting just for ourselves, but for the American people. God says "Thou shall not lie" as a commandment, it isn't just there to create a burden, it is to save us from our own self destruction...

Without the excess of pages, the Justices may not be able to have a clear understanding and make a fair assessment of all the issues involved in this case, and how and why it ended up here all the way to the United States Courts.

I feel thankful to seek justice, but I feel in my heart and soul I was not treated fair due to the present libel laws, considering I was not allowed to present my facts and truth in a court, in front of a jury due to the "lawful matters" listed

above.

May God touch your heart to make the right decision.
