MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Dalton Smith requests an extension of time to submit his petition for writ of certiorari. Because Mr. Smith is an indigent prisoner proceeding pro se, he requests until December 20, 2019 to file.

Mr. Smith is incarcerated at the Coleman Correctional Complex in Coleman, Florida. While the prison has some resources that Mr. Smith may access to help him in preparing his writ (12 law library terminals, 6 working typewriters, and 1 copy machine), they are shared between the approximately 2,000 inmates for limited hours. When situations occur that could even vaguely threaten the security of the complex, the compound is immediately closed, depriving Mr. Smith of access to the needed resources. It is a necessary inconvenience resulting from an overcrowded, understaffed, and rapidly deteriorating prison.

Mr. Smith therefore requests until December 20, 2019 to file his petition.


