ORDER

Before: CANBY, GRABER, and MURGUIA, Circuit Judges.

The district court certified that this appeal is frivolous and revoked appellant's in forma pauperis status. *See* 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a). On August 24, 2018, the court ordered appellant to explain in writing why this appeal should not be dismissed as frivolous. *See* 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2) (court shall dismiss case at any time, if court determines it is frivolous or malicious).

Upon a review of the record, the response to the court's August 24, 2018 order, and the opening brief filed on August 14, 2018, we conclude this appeal is frivolous. We therefore deny appellant's motion to proceed in forma pauperis (Docket Entry No. 26), and dismiss this appeal as frivolous, pursuant to 28 U.S.C.
