Petitioner's Motion For Extension Of Time To  
File Writ Of Certiorari

Comes now, Petitioner, prose, and moves for the  
Court to allow Petitioner an extension of time up to 60 days  
to file his Writ Of Certiorari pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2101 (c);  
Sup. Ct. R. 13.1 and 13.5.

Petitioner's Motion To Proceed In Forma Pauperis was  
denied by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit on  
September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The Court allowed Petitioner an extra  
14 days to pay the filing fee or his case will be dismissed. Officially  
Petitioner's case in the Court Of Appeals was dismissed on  
October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2019 which is 14 days after September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2019.  
Petitioner does not have any money to pay so he seen no reason to  
entertain the idea of trying to pay the \$505.00 docketing fee.

Petitioner's deadline for the 90 days to file a Writ Of  
Certiorari is January 1<sup>st</sup> 2020 and Petitioner asks the Honorable  
Supreme Court to allow Petitioner an extension of time up to  
60 days pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2101 (c); Sup. Ct. R. 13.1 and 13.5 which  
would be a new deadline of March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020.
