ORDER

Aksal's application for a certificate of appealability is denied. See 28 U.S.C. § 2253(c). Jurists of reason would agree without debate that Aksal's motion for audio recordings was, in essence, a 28 U.S.C. § 2255 motion that the District Court was required to stay and then dismiss for lack of jurisdiction upon the conclusion of the appellate proceedings concerning Aksal's first § 2255 motion. See United States v. Santarelli, 929 F.3d 95, 104–05 (3d Cir. 2019); Blystone v. Horn, 664 F.3d 397, 413 (3d Cir. 2011); Robinson v. Johnson, 313 F.3d 128, 139–40 (3d Cir. 2002). Jurists of reason would likewise agree that his claim fails on the merits for essentially the reasons provided

by the District Court. See Smith v. U.S. Dist. Ct. Officers, 203 F.3d 440, 442 (7th Cir. 2000).


