Subject: A request for the United States Supreme Court to review and approve my Letter of Application requesting sixty (60) day extension of time to submit a Writ Certiorari to the United States Supreme Court

At this time, the United States Supreme Court is asked to review the Georgia Supreme Court's order dated October 3, 2019 in consideration of a 60 day extension to file a Writ of Certiorari.

The reason why an extension of time (60 days) is needed to file a Writ Petition with the United States Supreme Court follows:


The GA Court of Appeals dismissed Plaintiff's case on March 26, 2019, stating Lack of Jurisdiction. However, extenuating circumstances had prevailed during the month of March, 2019. Plaintiff's daughter was suddenly diagnosed with lung cancer. The unexpected diagnosis and subsequent death on May 17, 2019, was a tragedy filled with severe mental and emotional pain. This state of bereavement and grief was overwhelming and indeed most extenuating. Hinderance to Plaintiff's attempt to file a Writ Certiorari with the Georgia Supreme Court around May 23, 2019, went unresolved.

This judicious consideration (an extension of time to file a Writ of Certiorari with the Supreme Court of the United States) is now requested after months of needed time to refocus and heal, following the family tragedy.

Most importantly, Plaintiff is now free to devote full attention to an appeal in this case. The additional sixty (60) days will allow Plaintiff (a female minority who faced discrimination) time to refocus, revisit and consolidate facts in this Personal Injury case that was a clear miscarriage of justice.
