Good Morning:

The State of Washington applies to the Clerk of this Court for a thirty (30) day extension of time to file its Brief in Opposition to Petition for Writ of Certiorari.

Extension is necessary and warranted because of an unanticipated and prodigious workload increase within the office necessitated by the February 25, 2021 ruling of the Washington State Supreme Court in *State v. Blake*, No. 96873-0, 2021 WL 728382, at \*12 (Wash. Feb. 25, 2021) declaring simple drug possession under the Revised Code of Washington section 69.50.4013 unconstitutional. All pending charges must be dismissed, defendants incarcerated on simple possession only must be released, and prior convictions vacated. All paid legal financial obligations attributable solely to simple possession cases must be refunded.


