Dear Mr. Harris:

Pursuant to Rule 30.4 of this Court and on behalf of respondents Simon & Schuster, Inc., Guy Lawson, Alexander Podrizki, David Packouz and Recorded Books, Inc.("Respondents"), I write to request a thirty day extension of the deadline to file Respondents' Brief in Opposition (the "Brief") to Shkelzen Berisha's Petition for a Writ of Certiorari filed in the above-captioned action (the "Petition"). The Petition was filed on February 1, 2021 and Respondents initially filed a waiver of their right to respond on February 17, 2021. On March 17, 2021, this Court directed Respondents to submit their Brief responding to the Petition on or before April 16, 2021. Respondents respectfully request that their time to file the Brief be extended up to and including Monday May 17, 2021.

A thirty day extension of Respondents' time to file the response is justified. The Court has directed me to file a brief in opposition to another petition seeking certiorari in an unrelated case (*Hamilton v. Speight*, 20-1123) on or before April 16, 2021 – which is the same deadline currently set for Respondents to file their Brief in this action. The requested extension is necessary to enable me to draft both opposition briefs concurrently. Moreover, access to the offices of my law firm have been restricted due to COVID-19. We also note that petitioner Berisha made use of the additional sixty days allotted by this Court in its March 19, 2020 order responding to COVID-19 and filed his brief 150-days after the circuit court decision came down. Under these circumstances, the thirty day extension requested by Respondents is fair and reasonable.

Counsel for petitioner Berisha does not oppose this request.
