Dear Mr. Bickell:

I am counsel for Respondents in the above-referenced case. On March 19, 2021, a certiorari petition was docketed in this case. Unless extended by the Court, the response would be due on April 19, 2021. For the following reasons, and pursuant to Rule 30.4, I respectfully request an extension of 14 days, to and including May 3, 2021.

I have had several pressing obligations in recent weeks, with more in the upcoming weeks, including but not limited to:

- Personal obligations throughout this time period related to a family member's medical care;
- An all-day budget workshop on March 27, as part of my duties as a Councilmember for the City of Ferndale, Michigan;
- Meetings, research, and drafting a COVID-19 Preparedness & Response Plan the week of March 29, a mandatory requirement for reopening our office in the State of Michigan;

- Two Reply Briefs due on April 19 in *Ray Ahmed Fayad v James McMahon, et al.*, U.S. District Court, Eastern District of Michigan;
- Plaintiff-Appellant's Brief is due on April 26 in *S. Baxter Jones v City of Detroit*, Case No. 21-1055, Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals, for which I am lead counsel for the plaintiff; and
- My co-counsel also has similar obligations, including deadlines or/and court appearances on April 15 for *Wetzel v EMH*, Macomb County Circuit Court, April 16 for *Delgado v Servpro*, Midland County Circuit Court, and April 19 again for *Wetzel*.


An extension will allow me and my co-council to meet our upcoming obligations and also to file a response that adequately addresses the points raised in the petition.
