## RESPONSE TO MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE BRIEF OF AMICUS CURIAE

The "various judicial proceedings" (proposed Br. at 1), in which the proposed amicus curiae represented Petitioners include this case in the Second Circuit, where she remains listed on the docket as counsel. See Pet. App. 5a (listing counsel on the briefs); Pet. App. 78a-80a (notice of appeal). Respondent declined to consent to submission of what amounts to a second filing on behalf of the same parties. Although the proposed amicus curiae also purports to represent the interests of "certain non-Indian landowners who hold title similar to Petitioner" (proposed Br. at 1), the title at issue in this case is based on a 2015 quit claim transfer from one Petitioner to the other of never-ceded tribal reservation land to which no land title had ever been

recorded before 2015. See Pet. App. 11a (describing quitclaim deed), 16a-20a (analyzing claim).

The Court should deny the motion for leave to file the proposed Brief.
