Dear Mr. Harris:

I hereby seek an extension of the time to file a response to the petition for certiorari in the above titled case. The response is currently due on October 29, 2020. For the following reasons, I request a 30-day extension to and including November 30, 2020.

I will have principal responsibility for preparing the brief in opposition to the petition. Because preparation for my oral argument before this Court yesterday took up considerable time in the last month, my colleagues and I will require additional time to prepare an adequate response to the petition. Furthermore, we have several upcoming deadlines and obligations that will prevent us from devoting adequate time to the response absent an extension. These include a reply brief due in the Second Circuit on October 9 (in *Pena v. British Airways*); an opening brief and appendix due in the Second Circuit on October 13 (in *Hromowyk v. FCA US LLC*); a Rule 23(f) petition due in the Sixth Circuit on October 14 (in *Kondash v. Kia*); an amicus brief due in this Court on October 20 (in *Shein II*); an oral argument in the Fourth Circuit on October 27 (in *Alig v. Quicken Loans*); an oral argument in the Eleventh Circuit on October 28 (in *Lucoff v. Navient*); an answering brief due in the Ninth Circuit on November 2 (in *Peck v. Swift Transportation* and *Mares v. Swift Transportation*). A 30-day extension will allow us to balance these other responsibilities with our obligations in this case.
