I am counsel of record for the Respondents in this case. A response to the petition for writ of certiorari is currently due November 2, 2020. Pursuant to Rule 30.4, Respondents request an extension to December 4, 2020, to file a brief in opposition.

We make this request for several reasons. My office serves as counsel for Washington's Secretary of State and is currently leading a number of cases relating to the election on November 3, 2020. I am lead counsel in *Washington v. Trump*, No. 20-cv-03127-SAB (E.D. Wash.), related to the U.S. Postal Service's handling of election mail for the 2020 election, and my co-counsel in this case, Tera Heintz, who served as lead counsel in this case below, is concurrently litigating an expedited election case before the Washington State Supreme Court as counsel for Washington's Secretary of State in *Alaska Oregon Washington State Area Conference of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People v. Wyman*. Ms. Heintz is also litigating a related expedited case in superior court, and we both anticipate additional urgent election cases to arise both before and after the election on November 3, 2020. Our small team that handles U.S. Supreme Court matters will therefore need additional time to ensure that we can provide the Court quality briefing in response to the petition. Petitioners do not object to the requested extension.
