We represent the respondents, J.K.J. and M.J.J., in the above-referenced matter. The petition for a writ of certiorari was filed on September 29, 2020. Respondents' brief in opposition is currently due, after one extension, on December 2, 2020. Respondents respectfully request, under Rules 15.3 and 30.4, a further extension of seven days, up to and including December 9, 2020, to file their brief in opposition. Petitioner consents to the requested extension.

The extension is warranted in this case both because counsel for respondents have been occupied with time-sensitive briefing in other federal matters, and because of additional burdens imposed by the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic and related closures and restrictions.
