Dear Mr. Harris:

On October 13, 2021, this Court heard oral argument in the above-captioned case. This letter is submitted to correct a statement made by counsel for the government at oral argument. In response to a question, counsel for the government provided a partial number of National Guard dual status technicians who could be impacted by the Court's decision in this case—specifically, the number of those who retired after 2004 and are receiving Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS) payments or are eligible to retire and receive CSRS payments. Counsel inadvertently stated that 53,000 technicians fell into that category. Tr. 51. The correct number is 5,300. We apologize for that error.

I would appreciate it if you would circulate this letter to the Members of the Court.
