Dear Mr. Harris:

The petition for a writ of certiorari in the above-captioned case was filed on June 15, 2020. Although the government waived its right to file a response, the Court has requested that a response be filed. The government's response is now due, after one extension, on November 9, 2020. We respectfully request, under Rule 30.4 of the Rules of this Court, a further extension of time to and including November 13, 2020, within which to file a response.

This short extension is necessary because, in light of COVID-19, this Office is endeavoring to minimize risks to the health and safety of our personnel responsible for the filing and service of paper copies of Court documents by reducing the number of days each week on which the filing and service of such documents are necessary and on which those personnel must report to work in person.

Counsel for petitioner does not oppose this further extension.
