

Dear Sir/Madam:

I represent the Respondent, Town of Boone, in the above-referenced matter. Petitioner, through counsel, filed his Petition for a Writ of Certiorari on October 28, 2020, and it was placed on the docket on November 2, 2020. Respondent's brief in opposition to the Petition for a Writ of Certiorari is presently due on or before December 2, 2020. Pursuant to Rule 30.4 of the United States Supreme Court, we hereby respectfully request a thirty (30) day extension of time within which to file a brief in opposition to the Petition for a Writ of Certiorari:

I am not presently a member of the United States Supreme Court Bar; however, I understand and acknowledge that the brief in opposition to the Petition must be filed by a Bar member. The extension will allow me an opportunity to complete and submit my application for admission. In addition to this personal matter, an extension of time is requested in order to thoroughly review the Petition, prepare a response, confer and coordinate with my client, and consult with practitioners of the United States Supreme Court in preparing Respondent's submission to the Court.
