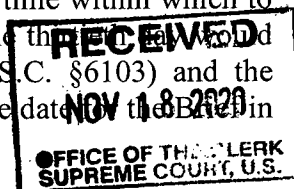

I represent the Respondent, Town of Boone, in the above-referenced matter. Petitioner, through counsel, filed his Petition for a Writ of Certiorari on October 28, 2020, and it was placed on the docket on November 2, 2020. Respondent's brief in opposition to the Petition for a Writ of Certiorari is presently due on or before December 2, 2020. Pursuant to Rule 30.4 of the United States Supreme Court, we hereby respectfully request a thirty (30) day extension of time within which to file a brief in opposition to the Petition for a Writ of Certiorari.
