MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED IN FORMA PAUPERIS

Petitioner Tommy Peña, through his attorney, Assistant Federal Public Defender Stephanie Wolf, who was appointed pursuant to the Criminal Justice Act, 18 U.S.C. § 3006A(c), respectfully moves this Court to grant leave to continue *in forma pauperis*. In support of this motion, counsel states:

5. Mr. Peña has not completed his sentence imposed in this case and remains in the custody of the Bureau of Prisons. As far as counsel is aware, he continues to be indigent.
