**O R D E R**

---

Terek Harper seeks to appeal his 87-month sentence imposed following his guilty plea to charges related to a drug conspiracy. The Government has moved to dismiss the appeal as barred by Harper's waiver of his right to appeal included in the plea agreement. Upon review of the record, Harper's appellate brief, and the submissions relative to the Government's motion to dismiss the appeal, we conclude that Harper knowingly and voluntarily waived his right to appeal his sentence, that the waiver provision is valid and enforceable, and that the challenge he seeks to raise on appeal falls squarely within the

compass of that waiver. Accordingly, we grant the Government's motion to dismiss the appeal.
