MEMORANDUM FOR THE UNITED STATES

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Petitioner contends (Pet. 12-17) that the court of appeals erred in rejecting his claim that Rehaif v. United States, 139 S. Ct. 2191 (2019), entitled him to vacatur of his conviction under 18 U.S.C. 922(g)(1) and 924(a)(2) on plain-error review following trial and sentencing. On January 8, 2021, this Court granted the petition for a writ of certiorari in Greer v. United States, No. 19-8709, to consider the application of plain-error review in such circumstances. Because the Court's decision in Greer may affect the proper disposition of the petition for a writ of certiorari, the petition in this case should be held pending the decision in

Greer and then disposed of as appropriate in light of that decision.*
