PETITIONER'S MOTION FOR LEAVE
TO PROCEED *IN FORMA PAUPERIS*

TO THE HONORABLE SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES:

NOW COMES Petitioner CYNTHIA HUDSON, who files Petitioner's Motion for Leave to Proceed *In Forma Pauperis*, and would respectfully state as follows:

Petitioner seeks a petition for a writ of certiorari to the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit. A copy of the petition for a writ of certiorari is attached.

Petitioner is incarcerated in a Texas state correctional facility serving a sentence of life without parole. As shown by the accompanying Affidavit or Declaration in Support of Motion for Leave to Proceed *In Forma Pauperis*, the only assets that Petitioner has are monies that are periodically deposited into her inmate trust account by her spouse.

Petitioner has not been granted leave to proceed *in forma pauperis* in any prior court. Petitioner's counsel's attorney's fee for seeking review in this Court has been paid for by Petitioner's spouse.

However, Petitioner asks this Court for leave to proceed *in forma pauperis* in this Court, because proceeding in this Court as a "paid case" will require the payment of a substantial sum of money (approximately \$2,000) to a printing service so that the certiorari petition can be prepared in the booklet format that is required by the Supreme Court rules. As stated earlier, the only assets Petitioner has are the amounts of money deposited into her inmate trust account by her spouse. Allowing Petitioner to proceed *in forma pauperis* in this Court would reduce the financial hardship placed on Petitioner's spouse that would result by

having to pay for printing costs of the certiorari petition and appendix in booklet format.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner CYNTHIA HUDSON, respectfully asks for leave to proceed *in forma pauperis*.
