Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, Respondents Yakima County and City of Toppenish respectfully move for an extension of time for filing their response to Appellant Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation's Petition for Writ of Certiorari in Confederated *Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation v. Yakima County*, et al., Docket No. 20-753.

The original deadline for the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation to file its Petition for Writ of Certiorari was Monday, September 29, 2020.
