

**ORDER DISMISSING, WITHOUT PREJUDICE,
DEFENDANT'S MOTION FOR POST-CONVICTION RELIEF**

THIS CAUSE comes before the Court upon Defendant's Motion for Post-Conviction Relief, brought pursuant to Florida Rule of Criminal Procedure 3.850, and filed on September 16, 2019. Having considered Defendant's motion, the Court finds as follows:

As the State correctly asserts in its response, Defendant's oath is insufficient under Rule 3.850(c), which requires a statement "that the defendant has read the motion or that it has been read to him or her, that the defendant understands its content, and that all of the facts stated therein are true and correct." See, Rule 3.850(c). As such, the motion must be dismissed without prejudice to Defendant filing an amended motion containing a sufficient oath under the rule. Accordingly,

DISMISSED, without prejudice.
