

Voice message sent by Sanaz Siyonit to Mitra Ardaneh: The way he wants to go to Iran has nothing to do with me. I wanted to give him seven thousand dollars plus a thousand dollars for his flight yesterday, but he didn't accept. Now even if he dies I'll not give him a single cent.

Text message sent by Sanaz Siyonit to Mitra Ardaneh: the police forces him to leave the house, he doesn't have the right to get near Amir and I.

Text message sent by Mitra Ardaneh to Sanaz Siyonit: Where is he now?

Text message sent by Sanaz Siyonit to Mitra Ardaneh: We got him a hotel last night. I packed all his stuff so that my uncle gives it to him. We have court date in two weeks. The fight tickets will be bought for him. They'll give him a thousand dollars. If he doesn't want to go back to Iran tell him to go to Europe where his friends are.


Text message send by Mitra Ardaneh to Sanaz Siyonit: Go finish this problem and let him go.

Text message sent by Sanaz Siyonit to Mitra Ardaneh: If he accepts I'll give him one thousand dollars from my own stupid wage.









Pt tried to communicate that he had been in the USA for 8 months after 20 years in Iran with his wife and children. After several days, he reports that he left the home and went to a hotel. He claims that his wife's family [REDACTED] tried to bribe me with \$7000 if he would leave the US and not go to court to press charges against her. He refused both the money (bribe) or to go to the airport on the ticket she purchased for him to go back to Iran. 30 minutes later his wife went to the police station and made a "false report" that he had allegedly tried to harm her by punching her in the face but claims that he did not and that she had no marks on her face at all. One day later he reports that the police came and he was arrested for A & B and his wife also c/o having been raped by him. 





HAMID REZA ARDANEH vs. COMMONWEALTH & others.<sup>1</sup>

Supreme Judicial Court, Superintendence of inferior courts.

The petitioner, Hamid Reza Ardaneh, appeals from a judgment of a single justice of this court denying his petition pursuant to G. L. c. 211, § 3. We affirm.

In August 2016, Ardaneh was indicted on several counts of rape, in violation of G. L. c. 265, § 22 (b), and one count of strangulation or suffocation, in violation of G. L. c. 265, § 15D (b). In August 2017, while proceedings in the trial court were ongoing, he was committed for observation to Bridgewater State Hospital for a determination whether he is competent to stand trial pursuant to G. L. c. 123, § 15 (a). He was subsequently found incompetent to stand trial and was committed to the hospital pursuant to G. L. c. 123, § 16. He has since been recommitted, and remains there still. In November 2019, he filed his G. L. c. 211, § 3, petition, in which he claimed, very generally and among other things, that his constitutional rights have been violated, including his right to effective assistance of counsel; that he does not suffer from any mental illness and has been "falsely" deemed incompetent to stand trial; that he has exculpatory evidence to prove his innocence; and that the Commonwealth is protecting the "alleged victim and her family"

because they are Jewish (and Ardaneh is not).<sup>2</sup> The single justice denied the petition without a hearing.

In his appeal to the full court, Ardaneh continues to raise a myriad of claims, not all of which are easy to discern. He continues to press his ineffective assistance of counsel claim; he argues his innocence and maintains that he does not suffer from mental illness; and he makes claims about the "Jewish mafia" and disparaging and discriminatory statements about Jews. Although he states that he is seeking injunctive relief, what he ultimately appears to be seeking is a dismissal of the indictments against him and release from confinement.<sup>3</sup> He does so, however, without setting forth any sound legal argument.

First, the single justice properly denied relief because Ardaneh had an adequate alternative remedy. Relief under G. L. c. 211, § 3, is properly denied where "there are other routes by which the petitioning party may adequately seek relief." Sabree v. Commonwealth, 432 Mass. 1003, 1003 (2000). To the extent that Ardaneh sought dismissal of the indictments, that was a matter to raise in the trial court in the first instance.<sup>4</sup> Similarly, a remedy related to his continuing commitment pursuant to G. L. c. 123, § 16, lies, in the first instance, in the trial court. See id.; G. L. c. 123, § 17.

Second, we note that Ardaneh was not seeking relief in the county court from any specific rulings of the trial court, but rather from what he perceived to be general injustices done to or imposed on him. His claims did not present a situation warranting extraordinary superintendence relief directly from this court. The single justice therefore did not err or abuse his discretion in denying relief under G. L. c. 211, § 3.

Judgment affirmed.



TRANSFER ORDER

COLLEEN McMAHON, Chief United States District Judge:

Plaintiff Hamid Reza Ardaneh, who is presently held in the Bridgewater State Hospital, in Bridgewater, Massachusetts, brings this *pro se* civil action in an attempt to remove to this Court what appear to be criminal or civil actions pending against him in state courts in Massachusetts. For the following reasons, the Court transfers this action to the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts.

A defendant in a pending state criminal action who wishes to remove that action to a federal district court must "file in the district court of the United States for the district and division within which such prosecution is pending a notice of removal." 28 U.S.C. § 1455(a). A similar rule applies to a defendant in a pending state civil action who wishes to remove that action to a federal district court. *See* 28 U.S.C. § 1446(a). Plaintiff's criminal or civil actions are pending in state courts in Massachusetts. This Court is therefore the wrong venue for this action. Massachusetts constitutes one federal judicial district, the District of Massachusetts. 28 U.S.C. § 101. The Court therefore transfers this action to the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts. 28 U.S.C. § 1406(a).

**CONCLUSION**

The Clerk of Court is directed to mail a copy of this order to Plaintiff and note service on the docket. The Clerk of Court is further directed to transfer this action to the United States

District Court for the District of Massachusetts. Whether Plaintiff should be permitted to proceed further without prepayment of fees is a determination to be made by the transferee court. A summons shall not issue from this Court. This order closes this case.

The Court certifies, pursuant to 28 U.S.C § 1915(a)(3), that any appeal from this order would not be taken in good faith, and therefore *in forma pauperis* status is denied for the purpose of an appeal. *See Coppedge v. United States*, 369 U.S. 438, 444-45 (1962).

**ORDER**

On April 30, 2020, Hamid Reza Ardaneh ("Ardaneh"), who is presently held at the Bridgewater State Hospital, filed the instant action with the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York. By Order dated May 8 2020, Chief Judge Colleen McMahon transferred the case to this district. The transfer order explains that this pro se civil action is an attempt to remove what appear to be criminal or civil actions pending against him in state courts in Massachusetts. The transfer order noted that the federal court in New York is the wrong venue for removing an action from a Massachusetts state court.

The court's records indicate that Ardaneh now seeks relief similar to that sought in Ardaneh's prior actions in this court. See Ardaneh v. Babai et al., C.A. No. 19-11228-NMG (voluntarily dismissed); C.A. No. Ardaneh v. Commonwealth, et al., 18-10385-NMG (orders of remand), aff'd, Nos. 18-1297, 1398 (1st Cir. Aug. 28,

2018); C.A. No. Ardaneh v. Calis, 17-12171-LTS (habeas petition dismissed without prejudice).

Although the instant action was opened as a "civil action," Ardaneh brings this action pursuant to the court's removal jurisdiction. Ardaneh's removed actions are styled as Commonwealth v. Ardaneh, No. 1681cr00418 and Bridgewater State Hospital v. Ardaneh, No. 1915MH0286(R). See Docket No 2 at p. 2 ("Notice of Removal"). Ardaneh's repeated attempts to remove cases from state court to this federal court is to no avail because this court lack's removal jurisdiction over his claims, either under 28 U.S.C. § 1441, or 28 U.S.C. § 1443. The cases sought to be removed are several years old and Ardaneh has failed to comply with the deadlines and procedures for removing state actions, as set forth in 28 U.S.C. § 1446(a). Thus, Ardenah has not demonstrated sufficiently that this court has removal jurisdiction and the cases would be subject to summary remand pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1446(c) (4).

To the extent that Ardaneh is attempting to bring a civil action in this removal matter, he may not do so in this proceeding. Rather, he must file a separate civil action and either pay the \$400 filing fee or move for leave to proceed in forma pauperis. To the extent he brings such an action, even if he is permitted to proceed in forma pauperis, he will be subject to the requirements for payment of the \$350 filing fee, unless he has been civilly committed, in which case he would not be deemed a "prisoner" within the meaning of 28 U.S.C. § 1915(h).

Finally, even if Ardenah's civil claims were somehow otherwise permissibly before the court, it must abstain under the Younger abstention doctrine. "[F]ederal courts have long recognized 'the fundamental policy against federal interference with state criminal proceedings.'" In re Justices of Superior Ct. Dep't of Mass. Trial Ct., 218 F.3d 11, 16 (1st Cir. 2000) (quoting Younger v. Harris, 401 U.S. 37, 46 (1971)). Congress has long expressed its policy that "the state courts be allowed to conduct state proceedings free from interference by the federal courts." Id. at 16. Although Ardenah contends that he is innocent and complains that he will not receive "justice," this court will not interfere with the state proceedings.

Accordingly, the Court hereby ORDERS:

1. The Application to Proceed in District Court Without Prepaying Fees or Costs (ECF No. 1) is DENIED without prejudice because no filing fee is due. Filing fees are not required for removal of a criminal action under 28 U.S.C. § 1443.
2. Ardanah's removed criminal action, styled Commonwealth v. Ardanah, No. 1681cr00418 is hereby SUMMARILY REMANDED back to Middlesex County Superior Court pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1455(b)(4) where "it clearly appears on the face of the notice that removal should not be permitted."
3. The Clerk shall close this action and mail a copy of this Order to the Clerk of the Middlesex Superior Court, 200 Trade Center, 2nd Floor Woburn, MA 01801.





## JUDGMENT

Entered: January 26, 2021

Appellant seeks review of a district court ruling that construed his initial federal court filing as an attempt to remove one or more state proceedings to federal court and that remanded said proceedings to state court. We assume, without deciding, that review of the district court's remand ruling is not statutorily barred. See 28 U.S.C. § 1447(d). After careful review of the record and the arguments offered on appeal, we affirm, substantially for the reasons stated in the district court's decision entered on September 1, 2020. Appellant's filings addressed to family contact and

visitation in hospital are denied without prejudice to reassertion in an appropriate forum and via an appropriate procedural vehicle. Any remaining motions or requests for relief are denied as moot.

Affirmed. See 1st Cir. R. 27.0(c).
