





Mayor Riley said, "Thank you very much, Councilmember Hallman. We will now proceed with public hearings. The first is to approve the Edward Byrne Memorial Grant Application to the Department of Justice for \$34,325. Would anyone like to be heard on that? Yes, sir, Mr. Bryant. Here's a microphone right here."

1. Anthony Bryant said, "Thanks for being here. Anthony Gerard Bryant, 2123 Courtland Avenue, Charleston, SC 29403. Social Security Administration, 1463 Tobias Gadsden Boulevard, Charleston, SC 29407 dated November 24, 2009. The only reason why that's the case is, is because I'm a victim of identity theft on a police report in error. The affect upon a person's person, physical and legal person, is that a camera can be used, and an image of the person can be in conflict with the legal description. I've attended the Board of Zoning Appeals meetings for many years. The affect upon a piece of property has to be appealed to Court. There's no need for that. I was not a witness to this report, but my mother and father, 51 years in this house provided me a temporary place to stay until my company was reestablished. My first company, Bryant Group, Inc. was affected back in 1993, a land use public policy, business development. So, I was born and reared in this home in 1968 with my two brothers, Keith D. Bryant, who's actually an employee of Charleston County Schools, who's mentioned on the police report. Therefore, the camera had an effect upon wherever he went, it would affect him in a negative fashion. My older brother, Arnold M. Bryant, Jr. would then be impacted by it, and my father who was disabled at the time, he's now deceased, would be affected, as well. My mother, Betty Bryant would be affected, who also went to Roper Hospital, her employment and somehow, someway, someone, something strange happened. So, I submit these documents because I'm a professional. I'm not a part of any nefarious and felonious groups, but when you're born in 1967, 1986 Census laws, many African-American men who drove up and down I-95 were interpreted as being other things they weren't. I was a college student at Morgan State University, 1986. I played football, played corner and free safety at Morgan and played inside linebacker at North Charleston High School, so I'm pretty competitive. My brother Keith Bryant was an all lowcountry basketball player, four years started in North Charleston, 4A basketball and taught at Brentwood Middle School for close to 20 years with kids that they did not want in the Charleston County School District. So, my mother and father were married since 1965, actually. My grandfather is a plumber, Johnny Bryant, a master plumber, and my uncle is Anthony Gerard Bryant, who lives in D.C. He came down to his brother's funeral, and told me basically he had some issues in Maryland. Well, that's my answer. The US Department of Justice: Office of Information Policy sent me a letter. Priscilla Jones, supervisor of administrative specialist to Bryant, Inc., which is my company, I make a request for a waiver of Mr. Bedard regarding my two concerns, immediately, regarding Appeal #201302940. All the taxes are being made to these particular people because in 1986, Census Laws, which was unanimously done by Republicans and Democrats regarding African-American men in Census tracks, voter-wide census tracks where I reside and lived my whole life. So, how can we assemble as men or assemble period, when we have cameras on us without the proper legal description in writing? That's a critical question regarding the matter. 
