Now comes Randy D. Jackson, Petitioner and
tenders his petition for rehearing addressed to
Supreme Court or individual Justice regarding
order denying to proceed in forma pauperis and
dismissed petition for a writ of habeas corpus,
and assigns as reason for the following:
(Pursuant to Rule 22, Rule 44.2)

1. The substantial effect to receive equal
justice under rule of law is extraordinary and
Congress's intent exceptional circumstances
that warrant the exercise of the courts
discretionary powers.

To cut off an indigent petitioner's right
to proceed in forma pauperis is to cut off his
access to the courts. This, in itself, violates
petitioner's constitutional rights.

The rights granted to the rich people
should also be granted to the poor people. In the
courts of law, the U.S. Constitution 14th Amendment
"Nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the
equal protection of the laws" 42 U.S.C.A. 1981 (as Equal
rights under law)

2. The Controlling effect is U.S. Constitution 5th, 6th, 14th Amendments listed in "Petition For A writ of Habeas Corpus Pages 5-14. Grounds: one, Two, Three and Four "Reasons For Granting The Petition" is not Frivolous or malicious, but Fundamental. Rights Violation.

These Plain legal errors Violates Federal Constitution, laws of the United States. That Causes Petitioner to be unlawful held in custody.

The rights recognized by the courts as being fundamental are the rights to be free from invidious racial discrimination.
