This letter follows the government's letter dated April 8, 2022, in which the government identifies a "control deficiency" within the Securities and Exchange Commission's administrative enforcement scheme. SEC Statement at 1. We write simply to make clear that the government's disclosure of this "control deficiency" in no way detracts from the compelling reasons to grant plenary review of the statutory question presented in this case. Indeed, if anything, the government's disclosure underscores the importance of deciding whether individuals in respondent's position may present their structural constitutional claims to a federal court in the first instance.
