I represent Carol Clendening in her matter against the United States of America including in this writ for certiorari. The writ is currently due February 28, 2022. I respectfully request sixty (60) additional days to file the writ of certiorari and a jurisdictional statement. The following request for extension is provided to the Court pursuant to Supreme Court Rules 29 and 30.

I was just admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court on January 18, 2022 – Bar #: 315581.
