I represent the respondents in this case. The brief in opposition is due on June 30, 2022. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, I write to request a 45-day extension of time to file a response to the petition. If the extension is granted, the response would be due on August 14, 2022. Petitioner consents to this 45-day extension.

The petition in this case is a conditional petition; it seeks review by this Court if certiorari is granted in *Gonzalez v Google, LLC*, No. 21-1333, in which I represent the petitioners.
