In this case, the parties stipulated that the Department of Education was named as a defendant to establish jurisdiction under the Randolph-Shepard Act, but was only a nominal defendant because it had no substantive involvement in the decision under review. The federal government did not litigate the merits of the suit in either the district court or the court of appeals. Accordingly, the government does not intend to file a response to the petition for a writ of certiorari unless requested by the Court to do so.
