Re: *Coverall North America Inc. et al. v. Carlos Rivas*, No. 21-268

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, Respondent Carlos Rivas respectfully moves for an extension of time for filing his response to Petitioner Coverall North America Inc.'s Petition for Writ of Certiorari in *Coverall North America Inc. et al. v. Carlos Rivas*, No. 21-268, by thirty (30) days, until December 17, 2021. Coverall filed its Petition for Writ of Certiorari on August 20, 2021. This Court requested a response on October 18, 2021, and the response is currently due on November 17, 2021.

Counsel has diligently attempted to meet the Court's deadline to file an opposition to Petitioner's Writ of Certiorari; however, counsel requires additional time in which to craft its response. First, Respondent's counsel recently sought advice from additional counsel, who requires more time to review the case. Additionally, conflicting professional obligations have made it difficult to complete the Response in the allotted time. In particular, counsel has been preparing for a week-long arbitration hearing set to begin shortly. An extension will allow counsel to meet these conflicting obligations and to receive the input of additional counsel in order to file a response that adequately addresses the points raised in the petition for certiorari. To most effectively do so, and to accommodate counsel's personal scheduling conflicts during the upcoming Thanksgiving holiday, the Respondent requests an additional 30 days to file his response. No prejudice will result from the requested extension.

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For the foregoing reasons, Respondent respectfully requests an extension of the deadline for filing his response to Coverall's Petition for Writ of Certiorari of 30 days from November 17, 2021, to December 17, 2021.
