I represent respondent in the above-referenced case. Petitioner Oklahoma filed a petition for a writ of certiorari on August 27, 2021, and this case was placed on the docket on September 1, 2021. Pursuant to Rule 30.4, I write to request a 30-day extension of time to file a response to the petition in this case.

In light of the press of other business, counsel requires additional time to fully respond to the arguments presented in the petition. Moreover, Oklahoma has filed a new petition that bears on the petition in respondent's case. In particular, Oklahoma's petition relies on arguments that it made in *Oklahoma v. Bosse*, No. 21-186, which has now been voluntarily dismissed. On September 17, 2021, Oklahoma filed a new petition in *Oklahoma v. Castro-Huerta*, No. 21-429, which modifies in certain respects its arguments for why certiorari should be granted in that case and in respondent's case. Hence, respondent's counsel requires time to review the arguments made in *Castro-Huerta* and to respond as appropriate.

For these reasons, I respectfully ask for a 30-day extension of time, until October 31, 2021, to respond to the petition in this matter.
