Dear Mr. Bickell:

I write to request an unopposed twenty-six-day extension of the time to file a response to the petition for certiorari in this case. The response is currently due on November 12, 2021, and I respectfully request that the deadline be extended to and including December 8, 2021. The petitioner consents to this request. There is good cause for this request. My colleagues and I have multiple upcoming deadlines in the upcoming weeks that would make it impossible to prepare a brief absent an extension, including a brief in opposition due in Southwest v. Saxon, No. 21-309 in the Supreme Court on November 1; a petition for rehearing en banc due in Brice v. Plain Green LLC, No. 19-15707 in the Ninth Circuit on November 1; an opening brief due in Juarez v. Drive Time, No. 21-11972, in the Eleventh Circuit on November 12; an opening brief due in Salter v. Quality Carriers, No. 21-55593, in the Ninth Circuit on November 15; an oral argument in Ngo v. BMW, No. 20-56027, in the Ninth Circuit on November 16; an opening brief due in Davidson v. United Auto Credit Corp., No. 21-1697, in the Fourth Circuit on November 22; and a reply brief due in *Thomas-Lawson v. Carrington Mortgage Services*, No. 21-55459, in the Ninth Circuit on November 24. For these reasons, my colleagues and I will require additional time to prepare an adequate response to the petition. A twenty-six-day extension will allow us to balance these other responsibilities with our obligations in this case.
