A response in this death penalty case is due November 22, 2021. The respondent respectfully requests a forty-four-day extension of the present deadline. If granted, the response will be due January 5, 2022. The undersigned requests this extension primarily because he was out of the country for a month, returning October 25, 2021, and the work that accumulated while out of the office has prevented him from completing a response. Of note, the respondent asks for forty-four days partially at the request of the petitioner's counsel to avoid a reply being due during the holiday season. Should the Court not see fit to grant forty-four days' additional time, the respondent respectfully requests thirty.

The respondent has previously requested an extension in this case. The present request is not sought for an improper purpose, including delay.
