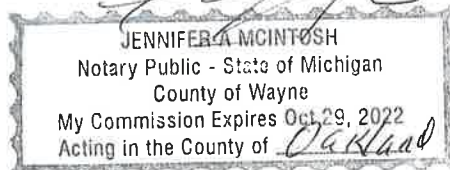

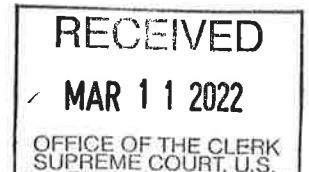

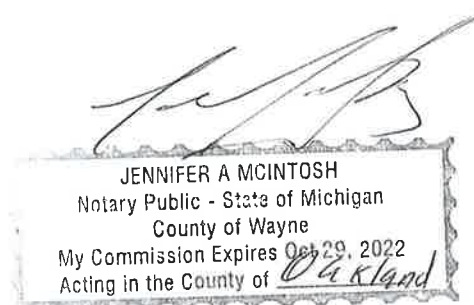

Petitioner Adrienne Bush respectfully seek the Court's leave to file my Petition for Rehearing.

In Support of my motion, the Petitioner states the following:

1. On June 11, 2021, Petitioner filed her Motion for Leave to Proceed in Forma Pauperis, asking the Court to resolve the question whether the bankruptcy code 11 USC 522(d)(11)(E) exempt employment discrimination and wrongful termination lawsuits. The respondent waived his rights to respond.

2. On October 4, 2021, the Court denied the Motion for Leave to Proceed in Forma Pauperis, however, the Petitioner was allowed to submit a petition required by Rule 38(a).

3. Petitioner complied with the order of October 4, 2021 and filed her Petition for Writ of Certiorari.

4. On January 24, 2022, the Court Denied the Petition for Writ of Certiorari.

5. Within 25 days provided for in Rule 44.2, the Petitioner is motioning the Court for leave to file a Petition for Rehearing after receiving written notice of the denial the week of February 7, 2022.

6. Here, the justice is best served by granting leave to file the Petition for Rehearing, mostly because the

Court should have the opportunity to decide whether the conflict presented should be heard in light to the substantial additional grounds and intervening circumstances that will be presented in the Petition for Rehearing that was not previously presented.

For the forgoing reasons, the Petitioner respectfully request that the Court grant leave to hear my Petition for Rehearing contained in Rule 44.2, and that the Court grant the Petition as the petition for rehearing is being presented in good faith and not for delay.
