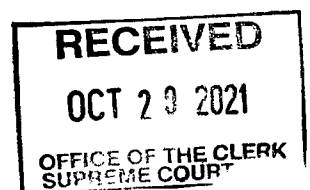

PETITIONER'S MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION
OF THE DENIAL OF THE PETITIONER'S MOTION
FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED *IN FORMA PAUPERIS*

Now comes the 82 year old petitioner in the above titled action and files his motion for reconsideration of this Court's denial of his motion for leave to proceed in *forma pauperis*, the following reasons being assigned.

1. The petitioner complied with all the rules for drafting the motion, including the affidavit pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746.
2. The petitioner showed that he had more than \$25,000 in credit card debt.
3. The petitioner owes the IRS back taxes from 2016-2019 in the amount of \$1250.
4. The petitioner had already been granted leave to

proceed *in forma pauperis* by the First Circuit Federal Appeals Court, and in the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court.

To deny him his motion would place an undeserving financial hardship, and he would have to borrow even more money to present his more than justifiable case to this Court.
