On December 10, 2021, I would like to request the court to rehear the case as the grounds are limited to intervening circumstances of substantial and controlling effect: in good faith for more than a decade to accommodate a solution. The dangerousness of this family court ruling and its explicit nature continues the unlawful division of the parent child relationship left vulnerable to the interruptions of the third party Defendant that produced documented perjury in the matter of 21-5621 as presented within the Writ Mandamus. The treatment of the minor children and disabled Plaintiff in this action are held to these permanent controlling effect(s) that resulted from the unaddressed procedural defect being allowed to remain.
