On December 10, 2021, Petitioner Murray Hooper filed a Petition for Writ of Certiorari in this capital case. The State of Arizona's Response is currently due January 14, 2022. Under this Court's Rules 15.3 and 30.4, the State respectfully requests an extension of 30 days, to and including Monday, February 13, 2022, to file a Brief in Opposition. Jean-Claude Andre, counsel of record for Petitioner Hooper, has indicated that he has no objection to the requested 30-day extension.
