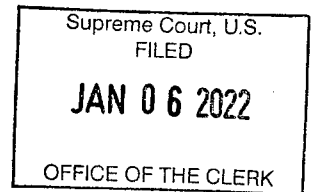

**AFFIDAVIT OR DECLARATION

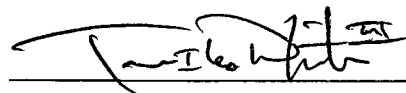
