MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED *IN FORMA PAUPERIS*

COMES NOW the Petitioner, Reginald Glenn; and, pursuant to Sup. Ct. Rule 39, moves for leave to proceed *in forma pauperis*.

1) United States Magistrate Court Judge Stephen M. Hyles determined Mr. Glenn was indigent on February 13, 2019 and appointed the Federal Defenders of the Middle District of Georgia, Inc., to represent Mr. Glenn under the provisions of 18 U.S.C. § 3006A. The Federal Defenders of the Middle District Georgia, Inc. also represented Mr. Glenn before the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit.

2) Mr. Glenn remains indigent and wishes to pursue a writ of *certiorari* from this Court to the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit, which affirmed, in an unpublished opinion, Mr. Glenn's conviction and sentence on October 6, 2021.

3) As the District Court for the Middle District of Georgia and the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit appointed counsel for Mr. Glenn, an indigent party, no affidavit or declaration by Mr. Glenn is required pursuant to Sup. Ct. Rule 39(1).

WHEREFORE, Mr. Glenn, through undersigned counsel, request that this Honorable Court allow him to proceed *in forma pauperis* and that the Office of the Federal Defenders of the Middle District of Georgia, Inc. continue to represent him.
